There are roughly 205 names of Gymkana court members (C), production staff (Pd) and non-gymnast performers in the show (Pf) with the year they first appeared in a gymkana program preceding their designation. I have also included the letter I have roughed out, but not the brochure. I will make some copies of that before I come down. Total new finds come to around 270 participants. Perhaps some of them have money and fond memories! Jack, 40 + new gymnasts listed by year of graduation and denoted by (G) beginning on p.6. These along with the 25 or so other new

"finds" make roughly 65 former team members we have found. Many do not have e-mails, and I have not taken the time to call any of them as yet. I sent you the whole list, as I did not know how to divide out one group from the other. Look forward to seeing you both this weekend at the Football Game Half Time Gymnastics recognition event bill"

Discussion with Mike Mann,

"Much as I hated FSU football and the AD of 1960, I am now a big fan of Bobby and the FSU team. My experience in the Athletic Dept. at Ga Tech while also a faculty member of the university, often teaching some of the athletes, tempered my view of football and varsity athletics in general. Coaches like Bobby Cremins in basketball and Bill Curry in football were straight shooters and were always very concerned about their players academic progress without trying to manipulate the process. I get the feeling Bowden is the same type of person and probably is the victim of an over zealous academic advisement staff. Bill"

"Carrie was a member of the United States Olympic Team in Montreal for the 1976 Summer Games. In her sport of gymnastics, she was the first American woman to ever score a perfect "10" in floor exercise and also was the first to hold the double title of national champion in both floor and balance beam. (Elite Nationals 1976) Carrie is from Tallahassee, Florida and began as a Tallahassee Tumbling Tot. In 1974, she moved to Eugene, Oregon and trained under Dick and Linda Mulvihill. Carrie traveled the world as a gymnast, from China and Russia to Bulgaria and South Africa. She was most known for her blending beautiful dance movement with dynamic and creative tricks. She often won, "Most Daring Beam Routine" when that type of acclaim was awarded. Now Carrie is CEO of The Zimmerman Agency, a public relations, advertising and interactive firm, which is the largest independent hospitality pr agency in the United States and the largest public relations agency in Florida. The agency touts billings of \$175 + million, 150 employees and boasts clients from Moscow, New York and Beijing to Hamburg, Hong Kong and Dubai. Carrie has been married for 29 years to husband, Curtis, and has three sons".
